FEATURED INSTALL: VICTORY LIFE CHURCH INSTALLS HME WIRELESS HEADSET WITH BATT'S AVL

When Victory Life Church of Durant, Oklahoma decided to upgrade their campus in Sherman, Texas, a significant amount of technology issues had to be addressed. One that seems to always get put at the bottom of the list is communication between technicians. Since a wireless solution was a requirement in this new flexible media space, HM Electronics was a natural choice. Batts Audio, Video and Lighting, the media contractors for the installation, provided HME's turnkey solution of the 4-up DX200 as the foundation for the wireless communications system. The DX200 system had been used by David Anderson, chief engineer for Victory Life, and he knew that the system was one that "just simply works...every time."



"The feature set of the DX200 and remarkable clarity of the system make recommending the DX200 an easy decision. Since the customer plans to expand the system, both wired and wirelessly, the speed of integrating new components make it nearly the only viable decision." says Mark Batts of Batts AVL.

The media space of the work at Victory Life required wireless communication with camera operators, the sound and lighting technicians, and the full staff of media engineers operating the massive 70' wide video presentation system. Interconnected to hardwired stations, the system can work in two modes that include communications with only wireless users or communications with all connected users. This is particularly useful in reducing the number of interruptions to wired stations increasing their ability to focus on the service.

The belt packs of the DX200 system boast digital communication that provides security, enhanced battery life, and a synthesized voice prompt that even notifies you if you have gone out-of-range of the base station. Sealed tactile controls also extended the life of the belt packs by eliminating the dirty contacts that always end up happening with equipment that gets abused while in service. To complete the 4-Up DX200 package was a price that made including the system in the original upgrade a no-brainer.



“You could easily spend 50% more with other intercom providers and still not get the flawless full duplexing communications that HME provides.” says Batts.

The HME DX200 system is a rock solid wireless intercom system with built -in expansion abilities for existing 2-wire and 4-wire intercom systems, up to 15 wireless belt packs, and a host of feature rich functions on-board.
